




1. 'Fake news' is a popular term often used to question the authenticity and neutrality of news reporting. What helps us to know something is true?




- 2. To whom is John's letter primarily addressed? Why did John write to them?

- 12. What might be particularly popular and dangerous idols in our world/culture? What are the idols of your heart? What practical steps can we take to 'keep ourselves from idols'?
