Take it in turns and read all of Exodus 3-4 as a group. Before you read, take note of the Exodus Themes on the last page.

CONTEXT

1. Going back to Exodus 1-2, find the times that God is actually mentioned. At a surface level, how 'involved' did God look in the first part of the Exodus story?

2. Where is the 'drama and action' as you read this story, and what's your reaction/questions to it?

3. What do you make of the way God describes himself in Exodus 3:14?



Take sometime in the week to google the Bible Project video - YHWH - "LORD" 4. Identify the number of times Moses makes an excuse and how God responds.

5. Using the Exodus Themes (see back cover) to help you, what do you notice about this part of the Exodus story? Talk it out as group together.

6. What do we learn about God from this passage?

7. How does this passage relate to Jesus and the gospel?

You might like to check out these verses and discuss: John 1:18, John 8:24, 54-57, Matthew 2:13-15; Galatians 4:4 8. What can we take away as examples, positive and negative, for God's people today? In answering this, you can speak generally, but try to make it personal too.

9. Talk about how each of us should respond to this passage, whether it be worship and praise, repentance, thankfulness, petition, ...
